Increase in "Twice Exceptional"

Twice-exceptional children are gifted children of above average abilities who have special educational needs - AD/HD, learning disabilities, Asperger Syndrome, etc. Because their giftedness can mask their special needs and their special needs can hide their giftedness, they are often labeled as "lazy" and "unmotivated".




Poor Sitting Posture


Stand Up For Your Health Physiologists And Microbiologists Find Link Between Sitting And Poor Health

June 1, 2008 — Physiologists analyzing obesity, heart disease, and diabetes found that the act of sitting shuts down the circulation of a fat-absorbing enzyme called lipase. They found that standing up engages muscles and promotes the distribution of lipase, which prompts the body to process fat and cholesterol, independent of the amount of time spent exercising. They also found that standing up uses blood glucose and may discourage the development of diabetes.
















 Wide barrel pens can make it easier for some people to write due to their contoured shape. With a Fat Ergonomic Pen there's more surface area to grip which makes it easier to write.







- 2003 study in American Journal of Occupational Therapy concluded that students with ADHD using ball chairs were able to sit still, focus and write more words legibly
- 2007 Mayo Clinic study concluded that a chair-less classroom increased attention and improved learning
- 2008 University of Central Florida study
 - children need to move to focus during a complicated mental task
 - especially those with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)—fidgeted more when a task required them to store and process information rather than just hold it.



Dump the chair?

Electronic Sensors Printed Directly on the Skin

New electronic tattoos could help monitor health during normal daily activities.

Taking advantage of recent advances in flexible electronics, researchers have devised a way to "print" devices directly onto the skin so people can wear them for an extended period while performing normal daily activities. Such systems could be used to track health and monitor healing near the skin's surface, as in the case of surgical wounds.

So-called "egidermal electronics" were demonstrated previously in <u>research</u> from the lab of <u>John Floors</u>, a materials scientist at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champelgn; the devices consist of ultrathin electrodes, electronics, sensors, and wireless power and communication systems. In theory, they could attach to the skin and record and transmit electrophysiological measurements for

medical purposes. These early versions of the technology, which were designed to be applied to a thin, soft elastomer backing, were "fine for an office environment," says Rogers, "but if you wanted to go swimming or take a shower they weren't able to hold up." Now, Rogers and his coworkers have figured out how to grint the electronics right on the skin, making the device more durable and rugged.

The researchers also found that they could use commercially available "spray-on bandage" products to add a thin protective layer and bond the system to the skin in a "very indust way," he says.

one-thirtleth as thick, and thus "more conformal to the kind of roughness that's present naturally on the surface of the skin," says Rogers, it can be worn for up to two weeks before the skin's natural exfoliation process causes it to flake off.



During the two weeks that it's attached, the device can measure things like temperature, strain, and the hydration state of the skin, all of which are useful in tracking general health and wellness. One specific application could be to monitor wound healing. If a doctor or nurse attached the system near a surgical wound before the patient left the hospital, it could take measurements and transmit the information.

Types of Reading Apps
