

Statistics to Munch On

- 14% of People with disAbilities are fully employed. PayDay!
- 16% of People with disAbilities are underemployed. Snickers!
- 70% are unemployed or out of the work force entirely. Kiss!
- Adults with disAbilities work fewer hours -command lower wages, and earn less annually.
 - Their median annual earnings are only 58.1% of the median earnings of those not having disabilities.



Auditory Processing Disorder (APD)

- "Also known as Central Auditory Processing Disorder, this is a condition that adversely affects how sound that travels unimpeded through the ear is processed or interpreted by the brain. Individuals with APD do not recognize subtle differences between sounds in words, even when the sounds are loud and clear enough to be heard. They can also find it difficult to tell where sounds are coming from, to make sense of the order of sounds, or to block out competing background noises."

Dyscalculia

- "A specific learning disability that affects a person's ability to understand numbers and learn math facts.
- Individuals with this type of LD may also have:
 - poor comprehension of math symbols,
 - may struggle with memorizing and organizing numbers,
 - have difficulty telling time, or
 - have trouble with counting."

Dysgraphia

- "A specific learning disability that affects a person's handwriting ability and fine motor skills.
- Problems may include illegible:
 - handwriting,
 - inconsistent spacing,
 - poor spatial planning on paper,
 - poor spelling, and
 - difficulty composing writing as well as thinking and writing at the same time."

Dyslexia

- A specific learning disability that affects reading and related languagebased processing skills. Dyslexia is sometimes referred to as a Language-Based Learning Disability.
- The severity can differ in each individual but can affect:
 - reading
 - fluency,
 - decoding,
 - reading comprehension,
 - recall,
 - writing,
 - spelling, and
 - sometimes speech and can exist along with other related disorders.

Visual Perceptual/Visual Motor Deficit

- A disorder that affects the understanding of information that a
 person sees, or the ability to draw or copy. A characteristic seen in
 people with learning disabilities such as Dysgraphia or Non-verbal
 LD, it can result in:
 - missing subtle differences in shapes or printed letters,
 - losing place frequently,
 - struggles with cutting,
 - holding pencil too tightly, or
 - poor eye/hand coordination.



Assistive Technology Continuum


Observations & "Hanging out with Intent"

What is an AT Service?

Assistive Technology Services

Any service that **directly assists an individual with a disability** in the selection, acquisition, or use of an assistive technology device.

Includes:

- Evaluating
- Providing devices
- Selecting, Designing, Customizing
- Maintaining, Repairing
- Coordinating
- Training/Technical Assistance student, family and school service providers

- Public Law 105-394 [29 USC 2201]



Human Activity Technology (HAAT) Model

- Human: represents the skills and abilities of the person with a disability
- Activity: a set of tasks to be performed by the person with a disability
- <u>Context</u>: the setting or social, cultural and physical contexts that surround the environment in which the activity must be completed
- Assistive Technology: devices or strategies used to bridge the gap between the person's abilities and the demands of the environment

S = Student/Skills

E = Environment

T = Tasks

T = Tools






Ergonomics

- Inhibits blood flow
- Creates muscle shortening
- Stresses back muscles and compresses spine
- Can inhibit learning
- Compresses diaphragm
 - Affects breathing
 - Voice quality

Lumo Lift

- Lumo for back and head/shoulders
- Sends gentle vibration alert when posture needs to be corrected





Modifications to the environment

- Provide natural light or therapy lamps
 - Simulate outdoor lighting
 - Many options...make sure designed for SAD
 - Light box should emit reduced UV light
 - Brightness will affect hours of use; consult healthcare provider for hours of use
 - Recommended distance 2 feet from user

Modifications to the work environment

- Provide private office or work area with limited distractions/low traffic area
- Noise reducing headsets/ noise reduction ear muffs
 - Can decrease help to reduce stress and improve concentration
 - Can also reduce ambient noise at night and help with sleep






Rewordify.com

"Rewordify is a free website that makes English easier to read. In some ways it is similar to a thesaurus, but allows users to enter not just single words, but entire sentences, pages, and even websites, for clarification. Passages are preferred, as difficult words are 'rewordified' using the context of the sentence. For example, paste in "The tempest raged outside while the throng huddled inside.", and it is 'rewordified' into, "the storm raged outside while the crowd huddled inside."

Students can use this tool to make passages more understandable. Simplified words are highlighted for quick comparison with the original word(s)."
